Job Title: Teacher of Economics

## The department

Economics is part of the Faculty of Sport and Social Science. The area is well resourced; A level teaching takes place in the modern Ashurst building where the spacious classrooms are equipped with interactive and audio-visual equipment. College-wide issues, including pastoral provision, as well as some general subject issues are dealt with at the faculty level. However, detailed subject development occurs within subject departments. Resources and ideas for teaching Economics lessons are shared within the department. In addition to teaching their subjects, members of staff may have other responsibilities including personal tutoring, admissions interviews and recreational activities.

The Economics department consists of five teachers delivering the Edexcel Economics course to A-level. This year nearly 400 students studied Economics, many of whom are very able and highly motivated. The course is well-established and has maintained very good results in recent years. The exam results for the department last summer were as follows:
