We are a dedicated and enthusiastic department, passionate for the subject and committed to the teaching and learning of Politics. The department has witnessed a significant expansion in student numbers since 2015 and our 2018-19 cohort consists of 232 Politics students and 12 Politics classes. Since September 2017, we have offered the Pearson Edexcel A-level Politics specification including Global Politics on the optional Paper 3.

All students have the opportunity to visit Parliament and the Supreme Court to reinforce their first year studies and the Department intends to offer a second year trip to Brussels to tie in with the NATO and EU elements of the Global Politics component of the course. We also attend first- and second-year student revision conferences in London. Many of our students participate in the popular PPE group, which offers weekly opportunities for students to extend their learning, including lectures by university academics and other outside speakers. Every year, many students progress to read Politics or Politics-related subjects at university, including Oxbridge. Politics draws students from all faculties and this is one of the reasons for its popularity and diversity.

We are a team of 4 full-time members of staff. Together we have a wealth of expertise, including Principal and Chief GCE A level Examiners and authors of published textbooks and journals. Each member of the department has unique skills to offer and there is a great emphasis on sharing good practice to improve the quality of our delivery. There is a strong team ethos, which encourages experimentation and collaboration, including team teaching and shared resources, whilst also giving the individual teacher and student the scope to pursue their own strengths and interests.

The use of IT is fundamental to teaching Politics here and our classrooms are equipped with a smart board, data projectors and laptops for student use. The College has excellent IT and intranet facilities, and a well equipped Learning Resource Centre. Our department intranet site is well resourced and utilised by all students.

There are opportunities via the Activities programme to contribute to other areas such as sport and everyone is involved with the delivery of the Symonds Lecture programme.
